Creating and inserting a Video Note in HTML Editor

Video Note enables you to create video recordings from your webcam and insert them via the HTML Editor's "Insert Stuff" option. The ability to record video also shows up anywhere video attachments are supported.

The updated verison of Video Note 2.0 has removed dependencies on Flash® technology and now uses HTML5. It reverts to Flash technology when it detects a legacy browser without HTML5 support. Video Note 2.0 is automatically available in Brightspace Learning Environment starting with version 10.6.3 and anywhere video attachments are supported such as Announcements, Dropbox and Discussions. Using Video Note Search, you can also search for and insert your Video Notes in another course.


The maximum recording time is 3 minutes. Perfect for a welcome video, weekly overview message, or even concept reinforcement.

You will need a microphone and webcam to record a Video Note.

1. In any D2L HTML Editor (Announcements, Discussions, Assignments, New file, etc.), click the Insert Stuff icon.


