D2L TIPS AND TRICKS

• Release Grades: Don't forget to release Final Grades so students can see the overall semester score! Documentation on how to release Final Grades can be found here. You still need to enter Final grades in MyClarion.

• Campus Pack Upgrade: On July 5, 2014, Campus Pack (blogs, wikis, journals) will be upgraded with a new user interface. The most noticeable change involves As we approach the end of another semester, we are preparing for the next Desire2Learn upgrade from version 10.2 to version 10.3. The upgrade will occur beginning at 12:01am and ending at approximately 2:00pm, May 10th.

During this time, faculty and students will not have access to the Desire2Learn environment. Summer I courses will be live in D2L 10.3 when classes begin May 12. Please note, that this upgrade date is part of a PASSHE schedule constrained by very limited windows to complete these system-wide D2L upgrades between the spring and summer semesters.

•Turnitin Reminder: Courses with dropboxes that have "originality checking" enabled "expire" on the Turnitin side about 6 months after the course creation date in D2L. (Mid-June for Spring 2014) Instructors cannot gain access to documents or custom Grademark libraries in expired courses. You should export any files and Grademark libraries from your spring courses. Contact the LTC if you need access to course in an earlier term.

REMINDER: D2L Course Purge

All D2L course sites for semesters <u>PRIOR TO SUMMER 2010</u> will be purged starting on April 28, 2014

As previously announced, the PASSHE Course Retention Policy mandates that we must periodically purge old courses from Desire2Learn. As our first step to compliance with the PASSHE policy, Clarion University intends to initiate our first D2L 'Course Purge' between April 28-30. This first purge will remove courses that were *converted* from Blackboard to Desire2Learn. In other words, all course semesters PRIOR TO Summer 2010, will be purged. As you may recall, the course migration from Blackboard to Desire2Learn <u>did</u> <u>not include</u> user generated data (gradebook entries, discussion board posts, student submissions, etc).

If you wish to retain a copy of D2L courses created prior to Summer 2010, remember to perform a course export and utilize appropriate storage before **Monday, April 28th**.

Blackboard Collaborate Publish Tool

Take your recordings on the road with Blackboard Collaborate Publish! "Publish" is a component product to Blackboard Collborate that enables you to publish your recordings in a variety of media formats for other uses.

Publish is for any instructor who recorded sessions using Blackboard Collaborate and who would like to have the recordings in another format for archiving, playback or sharing. It is very easy to use and enables you to convert your recordings to a variety of output formats (.mp4, .wmv, .mp3, etc.) enabling the preservation of your files outside of D2L.

Currently, because access to your archives in D2L is restricted to students enrolled in your course, access to these same archives in future courses must be given by **copying the URL of the recording** and creating a new link in your active course. This URL is also the mechanism used to publish the recording in another format. Please see "how to" documentation here. (need)
