Collaborate / ZOOM Reminder

ZOOM Video Conferencing - As previously announced, Zoom is replacing Blackboard Collaborate as our web conferencing system. The initial launch of our Zoom project is focused on faculty use in Summer 2018 courses. The LTC will continue direct outreach to faculty teaching summer courses for Zoom training and support. Other faculty and staff can opt-in to be early adopters / testers of the Zoom service. Now, when instructors use Start and End dates in their Course Admin > Course Offering Information area, students will be able to see their future courses or past courses and the course status. This visibilty does not affect course access. "Inactive" courses remain "invisible" to students in the My Courses area.

• NEW: Quiz question experience Opt-in:

Instructors will see an "opt-in" option when creating new quiz questions that are commonly used question types, including: \mathbf{MC} - Multiple Choice, $\mathbf{T/F}$ - True/False, \mathbf{SA} - Short Answer, and \mathbf{WR} - Written Response. The new experience streamlines the quiz question creation process by simplifying the question interface and user experience.

Instructors may "turn-off" or "opt-out" of the New Quiz Question Experience at any time.
