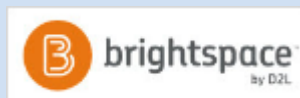

## Summer '19 Retreat: Building Success for all Students

More than 25 faculty and staff attended the **Partner's in Teaching, Learning, and Assessment and Learning Technology Center** summer retreat. The morning session provided insight to who Clarion students are. Josh Domitrovich, Chris Hearst, Ron Radaker, and Tom Crissman shared how they help students plan for success from from Day 1 at Clarion and how faculty can help shape and strengthen a culture of success.

The remainder of the day included specific strategies for immediate implementation. Offerings included discussions of learner-centered syllabi (Jeanne Slattery), transparent assignments (Kim Schwabenbauer), student-centered, cafeteria-style assignments (Paul Woodburne), assignments that engage freshmen in a spirit of critical inquiry (Leah Chambers), and creating accessible documents and using D2L Readspeaker and accessibility checker. Attendees enjoyed the last activity: 5-minute "lightning talks" where presenters described one thing that can make a difference in learning. Sessions included: Jin Qu on Mentimeter, Sue and Darla on 'small changes' in online course design, Jeanne Slattery on syllabus quizzes and Miguel Olivas-Lujan on *The Slow Professor*. Follow-up sessions on Accessibility and online course design are planned.

## What's New in D2L?



• **NEW Quiz Builder 'opt-in':** D2L has introduced a streamlined workflow for building and arranging quiz content. Instructors can work from a single interface to add questions, sections and question pools, or edit, delete and reorder questions. You can use the new Quiz Builder experience by clicking **Add/Edit Questions** on the quiz **Properties** tab and selecting "turn it on". The Quiz Builder experience will be "on" by default in the **MAY 2020** release.

• **WIGGIO:** Due to tool end-of-life, Wiggio will be **removed** from the Communication menu in D2L courses **December 13, 2019**. If you have content that you would like to save such as 'conversations', files/folders, events, links, polls, etc., please reach out to the LTC for instructions.

• **RUBRICS:** Use Firefox or Chrome when grading with rubrics in D2L. Microsoft's Edge browser does not automatically sum the criterion scores.

The Quality Matters Rubric is based on national Standards of best practice, research literature and instructional design principals. The Quality Matter [Highers Education Rubric 6th edition](#)

(2018) consists of eight general standards and 42 specific standards used to evaluate the design of online and blended courses. For example, Standard 2.4 states that "*The relationship between learning objectives or competencies and course activities is clearly stated.*"
