Public History Projects

Stories from the PA Wilds. 2019-Present

O A podcast being created and launched by the History program within the Department of Social Sciences at Clarion University. This podcast will focus on stories that come from and impact the region known as the Pennsylvania Wilds, which includes Clarion County and the surrounding region. While still in development, season one will air in the Spring of 2020 and focus on the centenary of the 19th Amendment and Women's Suffrage in the region. Critically, this project provides opportunities for Clarion University History students to do external research, create digital media in conjunction with their professors, and learn skills outside of traditional historical avenues.
