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## Computer Tip: My Favorite Keyboard Shortcuts



There was a time when I would watch a “computer geek” in front of the computer and was amazed how they used the keyboard. It seemed crazy to me that they used the keyboard instead of the mouse! Perhaps I’ve gone over to the geek side, but more and more, I find that keyboard shortcuts are quicker and simpler. Here are a few of my favorites:

**CUT:** Select some text or an image and use Ctrl + X to cut it from the page. (Hint: Remember that the X sort of looks like a pair of scissors.)

**COPY:** Select some text or an image and use Ctrl + C to copy to the clipboard. (Hint: Remember that C stands for copy.)

**PASTE:** After you’ve cut or copied text or an image, position the insertion point and use Ctrl + V to paste it in. (Why “V”? Probably because it is next to the X and C on the keyboard. If you use your imagination, though, it looks a little like an arrow – as if to say, “Paste it here.”)

**SELECT ALL:** Instead of dragging your mouse through an entire document to select it, try using Ctrl + A (Hint: A stands for all.)

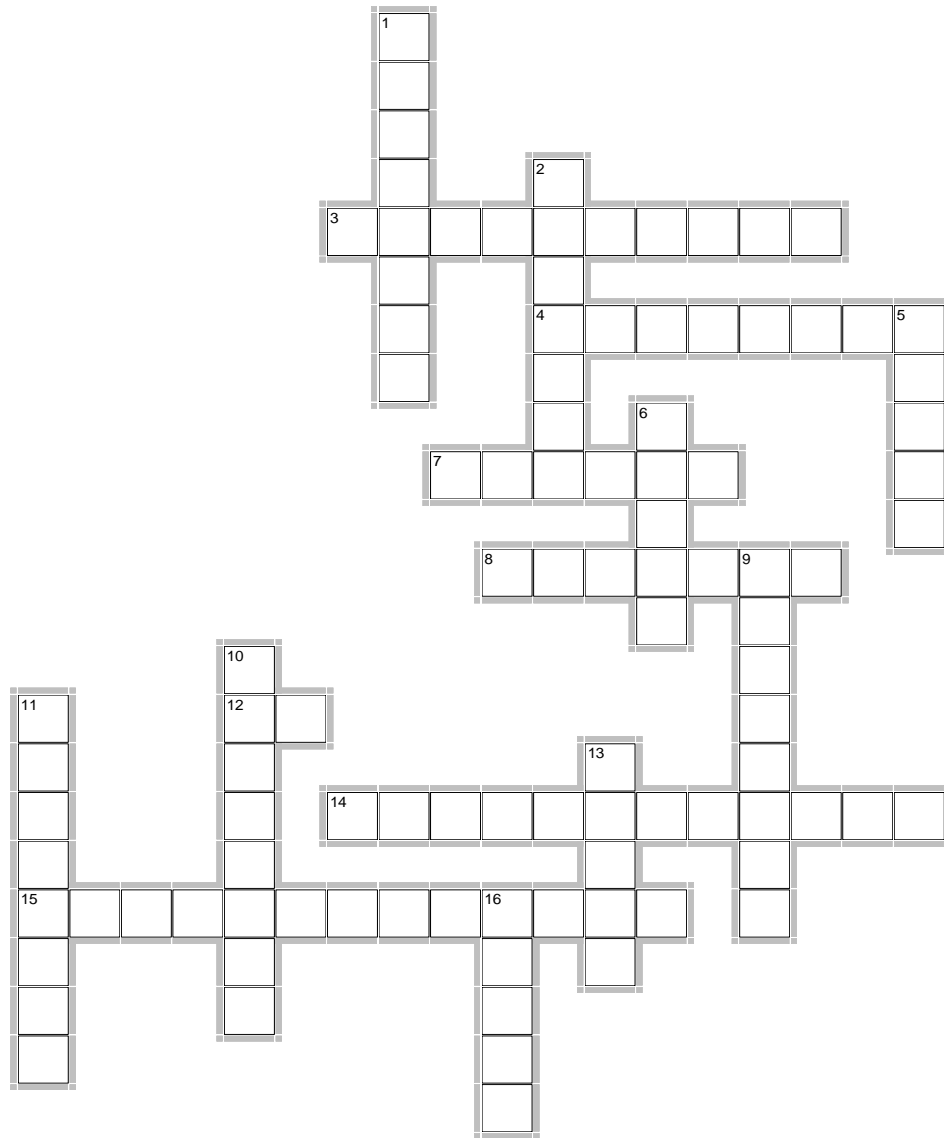
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## Library Fun: Crossword
