Information Literacy Workshops - Friday



Join us on **Friday at 2:00 p.m. in Room 215 of the Carlson library** as Dorothy Warner, author of *A Disciplinary Blueprint for the Assessment of Information Literacy*, offers a workshop for Clarion Faculty, Administrators, and Staff. Ms. Warner is currently an Assistant Librarian at Georgetown

University's Lauinger Library.

During this hands-on workshop, participants will work on identifying information literacy skills in their students, discuss an interdisciplinary approach to information literacy skills, and learn the basics of developing disciplinary and interdisciplinary curriculum maps.

Interested students and local librarians are invited to participate in a separate workshop on **Friday morning at 10:00 a.m.**, as Ms. Warner addresses ways to improve student learning of information literacy skills in the learning community – as well as recognizing the benefits of curriculum mapping for building research skills. Computer Tip: Documents With “Odd” Names?

Have you noticed that sometimes your documents folder has files with “odd” names? Some of them have this little ~\$ sign before the name of the document omitting the first one or two letters of the document. What does it mean?

Well it’s nothing too scary! What you are looking at is a hidden temporary file that is created when you have a document open. It’s where all the new data you type sits until you Save the changes.

Sometimes these temporary files stay on your system after you close, or if the system crashes with the document opened. If you don't have any documents open, then you can delete temporary files with no worries. The original should still be there.
