Library Tip: Flash Drives, Batteries, and Supplies



You are at Carlson Library on a cold, rainy evening and you need a flash drive, battery, or other item. You don't want to go back home for it. What do you do?

Check out the vending machine on Level A, near the Computer Lab Print Station. It offers pens, mechanical pencils, markers, blue books, batteries, Tylenol, Vivarin, Halls Cough Drops, CDs, flash drives, and a number of other, useful items for sale. The machine is owned and operated by the campus Book Center.

Computer Tip: Arrow Keys Quick Tip



Here's a cool little arrow trick to try with word processing programs. The next time you are using your arrow keys to go from one area of a sentence to another (left and right

arrows), hold down your **CTRL** key. Instead of moving one *space* at a time, you will go one *word* at a time.

If you are using the up and down arrows to go from line to line, holding down the **CTRL** key will make your cursor jump from paragraph to paragraph (well, from carriage return to carriage return anyway).

One last thing, if you hold down the **SHIFT** key while you do this (i.e. hold down **SHIFT + CTRL** at the same time), you select text as you arrow along.

This technique has been tested in MS Word, Wordpad, Notepad, and Open Office Writer, but it *should* work no matter what word processing program you use.
