Virtual Campus/Distance Education Support

New! Literature Criticism Online



Need to see what others are saying about a writer or literary work? Check out [Literature Criticism Online](#).

[Literature Criticism Online](#) brings together scholarly and popular commentary from books, periodicals, encyclopedias, and pamphlets. It includes information from some of the most acclaimed literary reference works, including *Contemporary Literary Criticism*, *Twentieth-Century Literary Criticism*, *Drama Criticism*, *Poetry Criticism*, and *Short Story Criticism*. These titles may be searched simultaneously with *Something About the Author* and *Dictionary of Literary Biography* through [GALE CENGAGE Learning](#).

This database includes thousands of essays covering a range of modern and historical views on authors and their works across regions, eras, and genres.

Library Tip: Laptops



Laptop computers in Carlson Library may be checked out for four hours – *for in-library use only*. These are high demand items, so to avoid late fees or fines, please remember to return them on time. Fees for late laptop computers and power cords add up at \$2.50 per hour each or \$5.00 per hour for the pair.

Don't forget that laptops are always due 1 hour before closing time.

Laptop computers in Suhr Library on the Venango Campus may be checked out for use in the library for four hours. However, they may also be checked out of the Suhr Library building for up to a 24-hour period. Ask the Suhr Library staff about this service.

As always, loans are based upon availability and require positive identification with a Clarion ID card.

Computer Tip: Multi-Tab Start Up

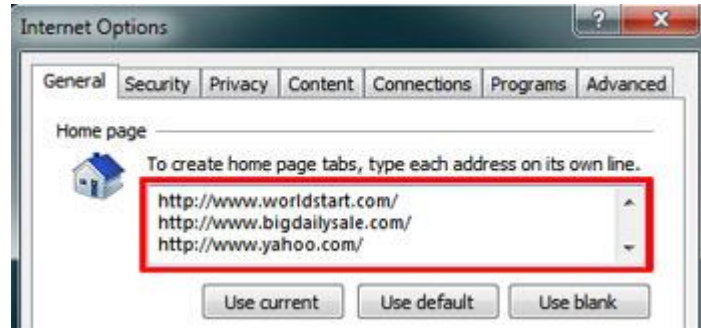

So that's why this Internet Explorer 8 trick appeals to me. Today we're going to learn how to make it so when you start IE 8 all of your daily sites come up in their own tabs!

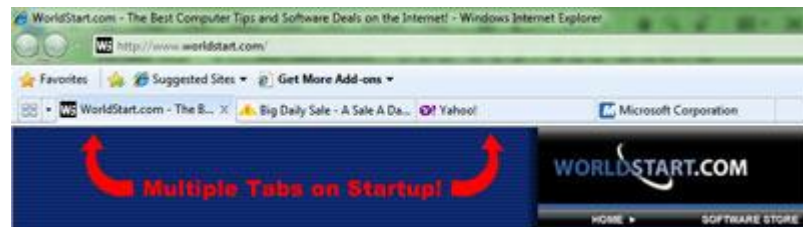
Open Internet Explorer 8 and click **Tools>Internet Options**.

Make sure the **General** tab is selected and under Home Page type in the addresses of the sites you want to open up when you start IE.

Like this:



Now click **OK** and restart Internet Explorer...and – voila! – you have your most-used sites open automatically when IE opens!
