## Popular Magazines Disappear Again?



Severe reductions in library budgets five years ago prompted Carlson Library to drop paper copy subscriptions to most popular magazines that are available electronically. Student concern encouraged Student Senate to step forward and pay the cost of *Fitness*, *Health*, *People*, and *US Weekly* in paper form

In December, Student Senate considered whether to pay the \$292 cost for these subscriptions for 2011. Senators want feedback from students before they vote and they are planning to conduct a survey to determine which magazines are most desirable. Consequently, the

paper subscriptions for these four magazines will end this month. Please let your senators know if you would like these or other popular magazines in Carlson Library.

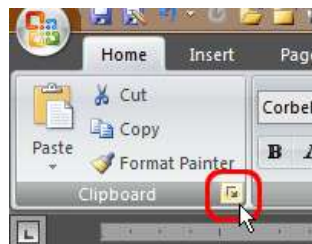

## Computer Tip: Two Dozen Reasons To Use Clipboard

We all know how to copy and paste in MS Office programs, right? Did you know that you can copy two dozen (yep...24!) items onto the clipboard?

A clipboard pane holds all of the items that have been copied or cut. Then you can paste anything from that list into any of the Office Suite programs. It's very handy... especially if you've got multiple pieces of information to move from one program or file to another. The question is, "Where exactly is the clipboard?"



On the far left side of the Ribbon's **Home** tab, you'll find the **Clipboard group**.

**Click the dialog launcher** in the bottom right corner of the group.

Voila! The Clipboard is appears!
