Films & Clips On Demand



Are you a visual learner? Do you respond better to information delivered through film? If so, check our streaming video service!

Films on Demand provides access to thousands of educational videos, film clips, and multimedia that may be helpful in meeting academic, vocational, and life-skills needs. Some faculty members have identified films or clips that are relevant to the courses they teach. They may already be included in your course syllabus.

The <u>Films on Demand</u> Website includes a search engine that offers access to films by title or subject. An advanced search feature enables searches by producer and date. The Website also offers access to films by broad subject categories, with additional subject subdivisions within each category. Other options include access to an entire film or to specific subject segments.

Library Tip: Videos, DVDs, and CDs...Oh My!

Looking for videos, DVDs and CDs? Carlson Library has thousands of titles and we welcome suggestions for new titles.

To locate them, first go to PILOT, the online catalog of library resources. For videos and DVDs select Video in the "Set Single Limit" option under the main search box. Enter the title or topic in the search box and click on search.

For CDs and other media items, click on the "Set Limits" box on the lower right side of the PILOT search screen. In the "Location" box select either "Media CDs Collection" or "Media Collection." Then click on the "Set Limits" bar at the top left of the screen. You may then continue a keyword or other search for your topic. (Through a fluke in the system, however, subject search will not work, but keyword searches will.)

Computer Tip: Think Twice Before Cutting!



Undo - Redo - Undo - Redo... I don't know about you, but I find that I tend to use that cycle of events a lot when I'm putting finishing touches on things...especially on one of my "picky" days when everything has to be perfect.

It's a great feature, but have you ever found yourself clicking the Redo button only to discover that it has been deactivated? What happened?!

Just one question: **Did you cut (Ctrl + X)?**

If your answer is yes, then that is your problem. When you *cut* something from a file, *the Redo list is cleared*. So you may want to think twice before cutting something from your document. A better alternative may be to use the "Delete" key instead.
