

Computer Tip: Separate Text Into Multiple Columns


Sometimes the original data entry is only desirable for the current project.

Example: First and last names were entered into one cell but the current use requires them to be separated into a first name column and a last column. Excel uses the *Text to Column*

feature to quickly perform this task.

Select or highlight the text to be separated and click menu bar.

- 2. Select Text to Columns... on the Data menu and Click Next > to get to Step 2 of 3.
- 3. Select the check box labeled on the left side of the screen for Step 2 of 3. This will separate the information contained in the single cell based on the space between the first and last name.
- 4. Click Next and Finish.
