Manage Your Research With RefWorks

RefWorks RefWorks is an online research management, writing, and collaboration tool. It's designed to

help researchers easily gather, manage, store, and share all types of information. It even helps to conveniently generate citations and bibliographies from items imported into customizable folders.

Dr. Terry Latour Dean of Libraries RefWorks enables students, faculty, and staff to create a personal database of citations. Citations can be entered manually or imported from many online databases such as EBSCOhost, GoogleScholar, etc. Citations can be formatted in a variety of output styles including APA, MLA, and Chicago.

A useful program within RefWorks, called Write-n-Cite, helps users compose scholarly papers with proper citations (in-line, footnotes, or endnotes) and bibliographies automatically generated from folders in the RefWorks database. RefShare allows a user to share a folder of citations with anyone, with or without a RefWorks account, along with any persistent link to its source and, if available, a full-text version of an article. In addition, RefGrab-It can capture citations from any web page that has citation information and can import it to RefWorks

Library Tip: Text A Call Number



Did you know that you can text a library book call number to your cell phone?

It's simple. When you locate a book or media item held by the library in <u>PILOT</u>,

the online catalog, click on the title to see the full description, then

click on the cell phone image or text: <u>Text me this call number</u>, beside the call number. Fill in your cell number, select your provider and send the message. The library location call number will be texted to your cell phone.

Computer Tip: Deletion...Simplified!



Here's a quick shortcut for anyone who's found themselves acting like a telegraph operator on their backspace key. You know what I'm talking about. You've just finished a

line of text, it doesn't look right, so you want to delete the whole line. "Ratta-tatta-ratta-ratta", and your finger falls off...

There's a better way! Simply put your cursor at the beginning of the line you want to delete and press **Shift+End**. This will cause the whole line to be selected, and all you have to do after that is press

delete or **backspace** to finish the job! The best part is that because your cursor is already at the beginning of the line, all you have to do is type!
