Library Tip: Eagle Dollars Accepted At Carlson



If you have a library fine or lost book charge at *Carlson Library*, you can now pay with Eagle Dollars.

Just let the staff person on duty at the Library Circulation Desk know that you want to take care of your

obligation with Eagle Dollars and present your ID card. They will take care of the rest.

At this time, Suhr Library is not able to accept Eagle dollars, but you can still use cash or checks to pay fines and fees.

Computer Tip: Avoid Reinventing The Wheel

In Excel



Excel makes it very easy for new users to use advanced worksheets without creating them manually. This is done by using "Templates." Let's say that there is a need to submit an expense report. Instead of creating one from the beginning, use the existing Expense Report Template.

- 1. Click File and select New.
- 2. There are standard templates that are loaded when Excel is installed. Office.com offers you all templates that Microsoft has made available for use in Excel.
- 3. Browse the selection and make your choice...without reinventing the wheel.
