# Savvy Researcher: "Using WorldCat" ... Today!



Join us this afternoon for "Using WorldCat",

the last of the Savvy Researcher Workshop Series.

The session begins at 1 pm in Carlson Library Room 201

and will last about 30 minutes. WorldCat is the world's largest network of library content and services.

- Search for popular books, music CDs and videos—all of the physical items you're used to getting from libraries.
- Discover many new kinds of digital content, such as e-books and streaming video.
- Find article citations with links to their full text.
- Discover authoritative research materials, such as documents and photos of local or historic significance; and digital versions of rare items that aren't available to the public.

Savvy researchers need to know how to use this resource to get those hard-to-find items.

## 36,000+ E-Books!



Did you know that Clarion University Libraries provide access to more than 36,000 electronic books?

Titles are available in almost all subject areas and more are being added monthly. Most can be accessed through PILOT, the online catalog of the University Libraries.

#### Did you know?

- Not all publishers will sell e-books to libraries
- Libraries can't purchase e-books from Amazon
- Some publishers withhold the availability of e-books until 3-6 months after the print edition is published
- Some publishers charge libraries 3-6 times the cost of a print edition
- E-books are licensed, and most can only be used by one person at a time
- Some publishers limit the times an e-books can be used
- Some publishers don't permit academic libraries to enable the downloading of e-books

We are doing what we can to acquire more e-books, and to make them available in formats that are easier for you to use.



# Computer Tip: Let The Painter Do It!



To make your life simpler – and your MS Excel worksheet easier to format – let the Format Painter help!

In this example, cell A1 is bold, italic, and a different color. There could be several other cells that require the

same formatting. Instead of going to each one and reformatting it, use the Format Painter.

- 1. Select the cell that will be used as the example for the other cells; in this case it is cell A1.
- Click the Format Painter on the toolbar.

(Click it once to use it once, double click it to get unlimited use - until it is clicked again).

3. Move through your sheet and click any cell that you want to look like the first cell you clicked (A1). Each cell clicked will be bold, italic and the same color as A1.
