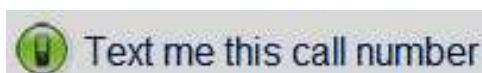

Student Tip: Text A Call Number

Did you know that you can text a library book call number to your cell phone?

It's simple. When you locate a book or media item held by the library in [PILOT](#), the online catalog, click on the title to see the full description, then click on the cell phone image or the text beside the call number.



Fill in your cell number, select your provider and send the message. The library location call number will be texted to your cell phone

full-access to *The Chronicle's* restricted content.

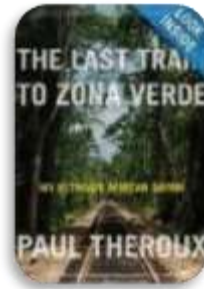

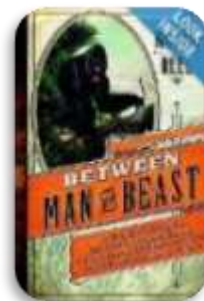
“Happy again, back in the kingdom of light,” writes Paul Theroux as he sets out on a new journey through the continent he knows and loves best.

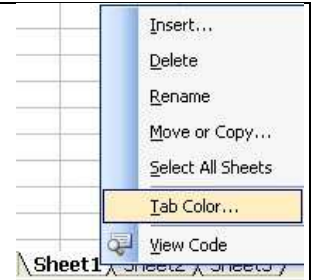
Hippopotomonstrosesquipedaliophobia is, rather ironically, the official term for a person who is terrified of long words.
