TIPS AND TRICKS

Make Courses Inactive -

Instructors, please make your older courses "inactive" so as not to make student course lists too long on their D2L home pages. The LTC had had many calls this term about removing old courses! We cannot remove the courses, but you can make your courses from previous terms "inactive". Refer to the <u>EDIT</u> COURSE tool for the steps.

• Student Grades Preview - Ever wonder what your students see in the Grades area of your course? You can preview exactly what your students see by clicking on a username in the Enter Grades view. On the next screen, choose "Preview" from the drop-down menu next to the student's name at the top of the page. The page that displays is exactly what the student sees in D2L Grades.

• Midterm Grade - While you can Release the Final (or Adjusted) Calculated Grade in D2L to allow students to see what they have at any time in your course, there are

New Look for Campus Pack

Campus Pack, the third-party provider for wikis, blogs, journals and podcasts in D2L, updated its user interface this summer, effective August 11. The new look provides more screen real estate for the user by bundling all the previous navigation into a "settings" pull-down menu. Instructors have a few more custom options including a banner image and addition of a profile picture.

All of the Learning Objects (Blogs / Wikis / Journal) still function as before.
