

# **CU Online Course Template**

In October, the Learning Technology Center (LTC) and Academic Affairs hosted the **CU Online Template Launch Party** to advance the adoption of the new D2L template for online courses. The objectives of the



session were to explain the evolution of the template, review the Quality Matters standards, explore research and discuss best practices for online course development. The template format showcased areas of the D2L Learning Environment that can be standardized for an easy-to-navigate, student-friendly structure, without limiting instructors' content.

Based on nationally recognized principles of online course design, the template is structured to meet <u>Quality Matters</u> (QM) and <u>accessibility standards</u>. For more informtion on the template, please visit the <u>CU Online Template web page</u>.

# **D2L Changes ~**

The December update removes the option to "opt-in" to the new Quiz question experience. Now all users will automatically experiencec the redesigned question interface in D2L Quizzes.

In May, D2L implemented the option for faculty to "Opt-in" to the new quiz question experience. The functionality is the same, but the interface has changed. Now when you edit a quiz question or question pool (formerly called random section), users will experience the new format.
