CU Online Course Template

The CU Online Course Template was developed by the Learning Technology Center (LTC), in collaboration with the Online Task Force, to assist faculty in developing a quality online (or on-campus) course site in D2L. Based on nationally recognized quality standards, the template is designed to meet <u>Quality Matters</u> (QM) and <u>accessibility standards</u>. The template provides Clarion University students with an easy to navigate, student-friendly structure, but does not limit instructors' content.

Why Use a Template?

The course template in D2L provides students with a learner-friendly, logical structure that makes sense as far as its layout. It doesn't mean that every course is identical, but that key features are consistently used. Consistency is a crucial characteristic of effective online course design. Some of these key features include:

- Customizable, pre-formatted "Welcome" announcement
- Start-here module *Links to university resources such as student support services, and D2L orientation activities*
- Accessibility statements and privacy policies *included for most* common technology tools
- Replace strings (where applicable) to help personalize the course
- Consistent, logical course structure
- Compliant accessibility standards including consistent formatting for headings, fonts, and colors

Learn how an instructor using publisher resources was able to convert his course using the new template and further engage his students.
