REMINDER - D2L Changes:

Effective December 9*, D2L users will see changes to the **My Courses** area on the D2L Home page and to the **Assignments** tool.

Highlights for the My Courses widget include:

Tabbed Semester View: Courses are grouped by 'All', 'Pinned' and 'Term'.

- ALL:: Prioritizes manually pinned courses followed by 'current' courses, up to 12, unless all are manually pinned. Exception: For users with more than 50 courses the 'ALL' tab prioritizes 'pinned' followed by 'last accessed'. Inactive courses remain invisible to students; courses with start and end dates will be visible, but cannot be accessed.
- **PINNED::** The Pinned tab appears in the widget only after a user pins a course in the 'Course Selector'.
- **SEMESTER**:: Displays all courses for the relevant term.

Highlights for Assignments include:

- **Updated layout:** Classic 'tabbed' view has been transformed into one screen
- **New 'annotation' feature:** If selected, instructors can annotate assignment submissions right in D2L. Highlight, comment, draw and more, directly on student submissions.

Audio Notes Updated

Audio attachments in D2L are no longer dependent on Flash and recording time has been extended to 30 minutes. Now in D2L assignments, discussions, and announcements, users can record audio without having to allow Flash settings. Use Audio recording for voice discussions, assignment feedback, or voice messages in an announcement.

TOCC January

The 'Teaching Online Certification Course' will be offered again starting January 4 with additional sessions planned throughout the year. TOCC spring sessions wil be offered: Jan. 4, Apr. 5, and May 3. This 4-week, online course was just recertified by Quality Matters in November 2020 and provides instructors with a student's perspective, guidance on designing an online course, and instructions for using various D2L tools. This is NOT a self-paced course.

Pilot Project - LockDown Browser® is a custom browser that locks down the testing environment within D2L. Respondus Monitor® is a companion product of LockDown Browser, using a student's webcam and video analytics to protect the integrity of non-proctored exams.
