

 BULK EDIT - One underused feature of the D2L learning environment is the bulk edit tool. Available in Assignments, Quizzes,

and Grades, bulk edit enables instructors to quickly organize activities by category, set availability, attempts or edit points. Bulk edit is located at the top of the tool 'list' view and the options vary for each.
